#### Fill Your House with Goodness, Truth and Beauty

This was the mantra woven through a five-day conference that presented, explored and engaged participants in conversations on issues of life and death. Brendan Malone runs Lifenet Charitable Trust, dedicated to planting and nurturing the seeds of leadership, virtue, and ethical concern through goodness, truth and beauty. [LifeNET.org.nz] Twice a year, Brendan gathers a team and launches Activ8 which studies pro-life issues that affect the family, whatever shape one's family may be.

Participants are immersed in knowledge, from effective leadership skills to pro-life history, to post abortion care, to harmful myths of 'my body, my choice', to euthanasia and eugenics. Such leadership is built by persistent charitable actions. For us as Christians, this is self-giving love. How do I love more authentically, more faithfully? Mother Teresa said: "Never worry about numbers. Help one person at a time and always start with the person nearest you." Each of us can respond to that call.

As we face greater challenges in our own families, our parishes, our society, we can see more clearly how the loss of community feeds a culture of death and destroys life. Activ8 upskills people who desire



to find solutions through goodness, truth and beauty. Whether one experiences an unexpected or a crisis pregnancy, or is faced with pressures toward euthanasia or eugenics, being connected to communities who embody choices of life and are committed to supporting those choices is foundational.
