Opening of the Unborn Memorial Garden

On Saturday 11th of May we will be celebrating the opening of the Unborn Memorial Garden.

The Community of the Beatitudes have taken on the initiative of building a memorial garden to the Unborn. Work has been underway on this project for the last several months and the community would now like to open it up to the public with an opening ceremony and blessing of the garden.

With walkways, beautiful statues, and reflection points, the garden surrounds the infant cemetery where babies who have died due to miscarriage, stillbirth or other infant deaths are buried. This memorial garden has been beautifully set up to allow family members the space where they can remember and grieve the loss of their little one, and find peace. The John Paul II Centre has donated their Oamaru limestone statue of a small baby sleeping on a koru fern frond to decorate the garden. The Beatitudes Community have also commissioned a beautiful carving of Our Lady of Guadalupe sitting down and holding three small children in her arms. These statues provide a wonderful setting for family members to remember their loved ones are held in the arms of Mary.

The opening ceremony will begin at 10am on Saturday 11th of May with a talk by Michael Loretz on The Pro-Life battle - a struggle for compassionate unity. We will then head over to the garden at 11am for the blessing of the memorial and a time of prayer in the garden or chapel.

The opening Mass will begin at 12pm followed by a potluck lunch.

7 Sorrows Prayer Group

Our John Paul II Centre serves everyday people who have been given a tremendous cross to carry. Let us support you through the complexity and trauma that happens with the loss of a loved one, from pregnancy through to adulthood.

Many people bury their grief deep within and sometimes we are looking for a way to embrace this grief with courage and hope, close to the Heart of Jesus. We can help you navigate your way through the different stages of grief and how to take practical measures to begin the healing process.

With this in mind, we started a Seven Sorrows Rosary and Holy Hour of Adoration on Monday February 26th February at St Teresa's church in Puriri St. We are grateful for the support of our parish priest Fr Michael Therese CSJ who has encouraged us in this spiritual ministry. There is a 7am Mass before the Rosary and we will meet on the 4th Monday of each month. We are also grateful to the Carmelite Monastery who have provided some Rosary beads and to some friends who have donated them.



For those who are not familiar with the Seven Sorrows Rosary, it was a Rosary originally revealed to St Bridget of Sweden in the 14th century and regained popularity due to the apparition of Our Lady of Kibeho in Rwanda(1980's) where Mary urged people to pray the Rosary.

Mary's Seven Swords of Sorrow are based on Scripture and help us to meditate on the suffering she endured as the Mother of Jesus.
